Bella Abzug, a former US Congresswoman, is a leading women's rights advocate, civil rights lawyer, public speaker, writer, founder and co-chair of the Wormen's Environment & Development Organization (WEDO), an international network with consultative status at the United Nations. Bella devotes her energies to a



wide range of women's issues. Breast Caneer became a focus of Bella's attention in March 1993, when WEDO, together with the New York City Commission on the Status of Women, which Bella chaired for 2 years, held a public hearing on Breast Caneer and the Environment that heard testimony from physicians, scientists, women's health specialists, activists and people with breast caneer, on the links between the breast caneer epidemic and exposure to chemical pollutants and radiation. Under Bella's leadership, WEDO has launched a national campaign in the US in partnership with Greenpeace and grassroots women's caneer groups entitled "Women, Caneer and the Environment Action for Prevention".

# PURPOSE / THEME and TOPICS

Breast cancer is not just a medical or scientific problem. To defeat breast cancer will require involvement from the global community. In addition to early detection, funding, and support programs, the community must promote policies and research that looks to prevention as the key to overcoming this disease.

The World Conference on Breast Cancer will involve representatives from every aspect of Breast Cancer with plenaries, concurrent sessions, and workshops in the following topics:

Prevention/Environment/Ethics
Treatment and Care
Research/Science/Medicine
Support and Advocacy
Alternative/Complimentary Therapies
Multicultural Issues
Lesbians and Breast Cancer
Men and Breast Cancer
The Politics of Breast Cancer
Genetics/Bio-Ethics/Law
The Media and Breast Cancer

The Conference will seek to address these issues by involving representatives from the whole spectrum of Breast Cancer, and will seek to discover what is being done, what is not being done, what needs to be done, what other issues face women diagnosed with Breast Cancer, and how they manage their day to day living with a life threatening disease.

Response to the conference so far shows that there is an overwhelming interest and an urgent need to continue dialogue between groups on this global level. Submissions and enquiries have already been received from around the world (over 40 countries to date) as well as across Canada. We hope that the result will be education and continued visibility of breast cancer, exploring the complex links between different perspectives and components of the disease, and especially the continuation of dialogue among those with personal, political and professional connections to breast cancer. Accordingly, the conference theme is:

Break the Silence - Stop the Epidemic: Opening the Doors to Dialogue Around the World
