#### **DEPARTMENTAL RECOMMENDATION**

That Planning and Environment Committee receive this report and video presentation for information.

#### **DISCUSSION**

The Ottawa-Carleton Water Quality Committee was formed in 1989 to co-ordinate inter-jurisdictional and inter-governmental surface water quality projects within the Region and near its boundaries. This Committee's membership is comprised of all area municipalities, provincial and federal agencies, as well as conservation authorities. At the February meeting of the Water Quality Committee, a decision was made to focus 1999 communications efforts on non-point pollution education and reduction.

Thirteen Water Quality Committee member agencies (see Annex A) have provided funding to initiate a summer television public awareness campaign designed to raise awareness of environmentally responsible practices supporting healthy water quality and reducing non-point source pollution. The cost to each participating agency was \$2,000 and all participating agencies will be identified as campaign sponsors. The Chair of the Water Quality Communications Sub-Committee continues to seek interested partners to increase the project budget for more campaign time.

The campaign consists of a 30 second commercial that will air approximately 500 times on CJOH, CBOT, CHRO, CBOT, and CBOFT from June to August, with week long rotating breaks from station to station.

Due to the high cost of quality television production and airtime, this public awareness and education campaign could not have been developed or implemented without the Ottawa-Carleton Water Quality Committee partnership.
