Re: Reduction of Sulphur Content in Gasoline

The Council of The Corporation of the City of Mississauga, at its meeting of June 24, 1998, passed Resolution 189-98 respecting the reduction of sulphur content in gasoline, and has requested that this information be forwarded to you for your endorsement.

This Resolution was passed on the recommendation of the Mississauga Air Quality Advisory Committee who are concerned about the link between high levels of smog and ground level ozone and the adverse health effects which result. A significant portion of these pollutants are caused by motor vehicles, and there is widespread concern that Canadian gasoline used by such vehicles has the highest average level of smog-causing sulphur among major developed economies despite a reduction of international sulphur levels, and that the gasoline refined by Ontario producers is the dirtiest in Canada.

A copy of Resolution 189-98 is enclosed for your reference.

We urge your government to enact measures to meaningfully reduce the sulphur content of Canadian gasoline.

We look forward to working with you and all other interested parties to resolve this issue.
