The very fact that Canada considers itself to be a multi-cultural, multi-racial, multi-religious country, reflects our own commitment to Oneness of Reality, Respect and Dignity of all Human Beings, and the Intrinsic Relationship between Human being and the Cosmic and Natural Environment around us.

Canada's commitment to being a multi-cultural, multi-racial, multi-ethnic and multi-religious country does not necessarily mean that we will subscribe to fundamental beliefs of any religion, racial, or ethnic group, but we will always accommodate, those aspects of their faith that do not contradict essential universal values, that happen to be Canadian values as well.

- The Humanics Institute is in the process of applying to be a registered Charitable Organization under the Canadian Income Tax Act.

- Develop and manage a multi-cultural, multi-religious, and multigenerational Humanics Sanctuary
